## ABOUT SIIP

SIIP is a ten-year SBD1.65 billion program to 2030, funded by the Government of Australia and delivered in partnership with the Solomon Islands Government.

## SIIP has 2 goals

1. Enhance the capacity of government and the private sector to plan, manage, finance, construct and/or maintain critical infrastructure
2. Deliver resilient, accessible infrastructure assets across the country that support inclusive economic growth.

# Current Projects



SIIP has commenced a large and diverse program of support to ten major social and economic infrastructure projects across Solomon Islands. A new Roadmap is being developed to further guide the pipeline to 2030.

Each activity is jointly approved by SIIP's Australia-Solomon Islands Steering Committee, co-chaired by the Secretary to Prime Minister and Australian High Commissioner. Permanent Secretaries of the Ministries of National Planning and Development Coordination, Finance and Treasury, and Infrastructure Development are also members, together with the Deputy Australian High Commissioner.



## Taro and Seghe Airport Upgrades

SIIP is co-funding upgrades to Taro and Seghe airports with the Ministry of Communication and Aviation and New Zealand. Works have officially begun in Taro with Seghe to commence later in 2023. **SIIP contribution AUD23.15m**



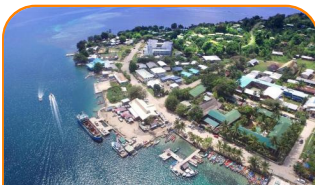
## Buala Market & Wharf Redevelopments

SIIP is redeveloping Buala market and building a climate resilient wharf and barge landing area to connect and grow local economic opportunities. Market design is underway. **Approx. AUD11.8m**



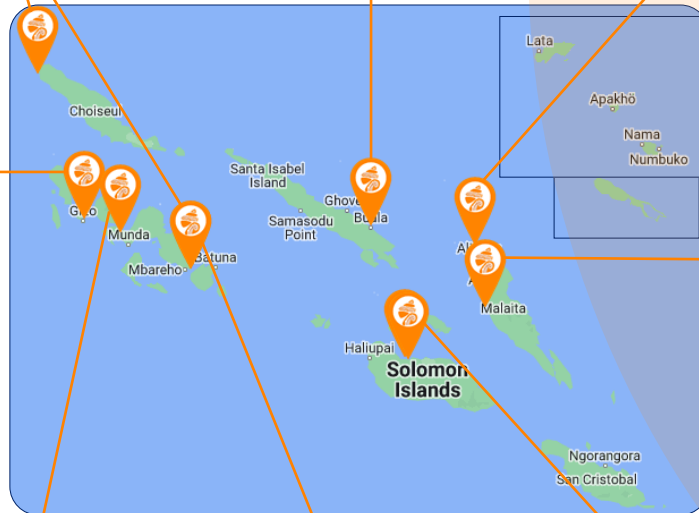
## Malu'u Market Redevelopment

SIIP is redeveloping markets across Solomon Islands to grow local economies. A new market has been identified for Malu'u, with design underway. **Approx. AUD3.3m**



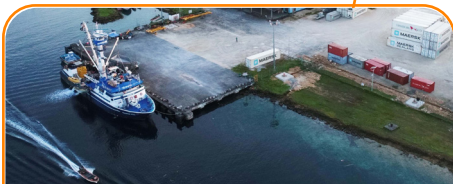
## Gizo Water Supply Project

SIIP is providing funding to Solomon Water to help deliver a new, safe, clean, reliable, and sustainable supply of water for Gizo town. The project will provide significant health and economic benefits for community and the tourism sector. **SIIP contribution AUD10m**



## Bina Harbour Tuna Processing Plant

SIIP is funding a water and sanitation feasibility study for a proposed processing plant at Bina, in partnership with Solomon Water and the Ministry of Fisheries and Marine Resources. **AUD0.7m**



## Noro Port Redevelopment

SIIP is supporting Solomon Ports to upgrade Noro Port wharves and facilities. The project will create opportunities for local businesses and increase capacity for fisheries exports. SIIP has commenced the feasibility and design studies needed to secure funding of overall project delivery. **AUD1.5m**



## Seghe Market Redevelopment

SIIP is redeveloping markets across Solomon Islands to grow local economies. A new market has been identified for Malu'u, with design underway. **Approx. AUD3.3m**



## Naha Birthing and Urban Health Centre

SIIP is delivering the flagship Australian-funded Naha Birthing and Urban Health Centre. The 34-bed facility will improve access to health services for the Honiara population, particularly for women and their babies. Construction phase has commenced. **AUD26m**
